

Tracey Margaret Clark was born in Duke St Hospital on 21st June 1970 into the family of parents Billy and Margaret, with brothers and sisters Gary, Elaine, William, Marie (died before Tracey was born) and Louise. 34 years ago, Margaret died when Tracey was only 15, but Elaine and her husband Jim moved into the family home in Penilee, keeping the family together.

Tracey encountered many challenges due to her special needs but she was well cared for by her family and the community.

Tracey loved Penilee and Penilee loved Tracey.

She loved music and her send-off was marked by a rendering of Amazing Grace by her niece Marley at Bowfield Crescent and by a recording of Run Rig's Loch Lomond after the internment.

There was a note of gratitude to God as Tracey was laid to rest: "...we must try not to be sad but to be grateful that God blessed us with her."

Margaret Stelmaszuk

Margaret was born on the 9th November 1924 and had four brothers: Jim, Charlie, John and Joe, and one sister Theresa. Margaret lived in Partick until she met her future husband Aleksander Stelmaszuk who came from Poland. He fought with the British Armed Forces during World War 2, arriving in the UK in October 1942. During the war years, Margaret made life-jackets for the Admiralty.

Margaret and Aleks were married on the 28th December 1946 and had thirteen children.

Sadly, two of the family are deceased, but Margaret is survived by eleven of her children and her sister Theresa.

Margaret was dearly loved and had 29 grandchildren, 31 great grandchildren (with 2 on the way) and 2 great grandchildren.

Margaret lived briefly in Dundee and Middlesex, but spent most of her ninety-five years in

Glasgow, settling for a large part in Honeybog Road, Penilee, from 1963 until 1987. She and her family were devoted parishioners of Our Lady and St George Church, which was the setting for many family Baptisms, First Confessions, First Holy Communions, Confirmations, Marriages and sadly a Requiem Mass for Aleks in 1985.

Two-years after Aleks' death Margaret moved to Swinton Drive, Cardonald and lived there until she required full-time care at Kinning Park Care Home from July 2016.

Margaret was a hard worker, loved her family and took great interest in all that was happening within the family until the onset of dementia.

She was a wonderful sequence dancer and joined many dancing clubs following her retirement. She particularly loved going on foreign holidays, both with her dancing friends and Jo, Jim and family. Margaret was a great friend to many and will be sadly missed by all.

Betty McFadden was born on 7th May 1927 to William and Mary Collie. Betty, an only child, lived with her parents and grandparents Johnny and Lizzie Reilly at 9 Stanley Street in the parish of Our Lady and St Margaret's; the same address as Helen Doran, whose cure of cancer was used to support the cause of the canonisation of St Therese. Needless to say the family, including Betty, were very much devoted to St Therese the Little Flower and reflected her simplicity and love.

Betty's memories of the war years in Kinning Park included memories of her extended family crammed into one room passing nights telling stories and drinking tea. She also told of how she and her friend had visited a local street after a bomb had destroyed some houses and of the local priest helping the casualties.

Betty married Michael McFadden in 1952 and they had four children Michael, Elizabeth, William and Joseph, and now has 8 grandchildren, 7 great grandchildren and another on the way and in them she took great interest, listening to them and loving them. Her husband Michael died in 2011 and her son Michael died in 1995 aged 40 years. Betty's strong faith and constant prayers helped her cope with these losses and was helped over the years by her family including her daughter in law Lynn, son in law Gregg and her friend Linda.

A faithful parishioner of Our Lady & St George's parish for 54 years, Betty died on 13th April 2020, with Lynn beside her in hospital. It was also the 17th birthday of her great granddaughter Libby, who with the rest of the family will remember her in prayer and know that Betty will continue to be praying for them as she rests in peace in the company of all the saints.


