
Sacrament of the Sick: For those seriously ill or going into hospital. Please contact Father Joe.

This Sunday the Feast of St Peter and St Paul.

The feast has been transferred from Monday 29th June the nearest Sunday. Peter was martyred, crucified upside down around 64 AD and Paul was beheaded in prison around 67 AD.

OPENING FOR PRIVATE PRAYER

The church will open for private prayer this week, 11am until 3 pm and again from 6 pm until 7 pm. We have a review this Monday at 11 am. Opening time on Saturday and Sunday will be 4pm to 6 pm.. This replaces the times mentioned on the video for this weekend. We are grateful to those who have agreed to be stewards to welcome people as they enter, guide them to the seats that are available, and indicate the one way system which is in place.

- Face coverings must be worn. Please bring your own if possible.
- A one way system is in place. Enter by the middle aisle and exit by the side aisles. Since numbers are quite low for private visits the front doors are used for entering and exiting
- Seating arrangement observe social distance. Wooden surfaces. It would seem, carry the virus for up to 2 days. Seats will be sanitised after use.
- Toilets should not be used, if possible. When they are used they are to be cleaned and disinfected after each use.
- The church will be cleaned each morning before opening.
- Sanitisers are to be use on entering and leaving.
- Candles are not to be handled but if you wish you can request the steward to light one for you.

CONFESSIONS: This week, all being well, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 6-7. Pm A screen has been set up at the front of the church, beside the organ, and religious music may be played which may avoid people being overheard. It may be necessary to remove the face covering during Confession. The seat is to be sanitised after use.


